Overcoming an Old Scourge with a New Face (HIV/TB Co-Infection)

I am very pleased to welcome all delegates to this 1st Asia Pacific Region Conference of the International Union Against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease (The Union). Tuberculosis is still one of the major public health problems in the world, with a large number of patients affected in Asia and thus in your Region. For many years it was thought that tuberculosis had been defeated and many governments and organizations neglected TB services in the public and private sectors. TB and HIV, MDR and XDR-TB are now global threats and need to be confronted with determination and enough resources. These topics are discussed during this Conference, and the organizing and scientific committee have put together an excellent programme which will stimulate discussion among colleagues coming from many countries with different situations. Exchange of experience among colleagues facing the challenges of tuberculosis is most valuable and will facilitate learning from each other. Recent events have clearly shown that tuberculosis needs to be tackled in a well coordinated way as this disease does not respect borders. We need to make sure that public and private sectors work hand in hand to avoid that patients get substandard or wrong treatments with the danger of developing MDR or even worse XDR TB. We are all responsible to ensure that health care systems are well organized to guarantee health care and access to medicines not only to affluent citizens but to all affected patients.

The Millennium Development Goals call on us to reduce tuberculosis prevalence and deaths by half by the year 2015. If we are serious about these goals we need to improve our diagnostic tools, find new drugs and strengthen tuberculosis services in the public and private sector.

Other lung diseases such as pneumonias and tobacco related diseases are of particular interest in this Region. Tobacco is killing millions of people every year and we have the responsibility to push governments to adopt strong legislation to limit the use of tobacco. Introducing smokefree environments in public places and in particular in hospitals needs to be given highest priority.

I am sure that this Conference through its excellent programme will contribute to The Union's mission to improve lung health in low and middle income countries. I would like to convey my sincere thanks to our colleagues here in Malaysia for having organized this important event.

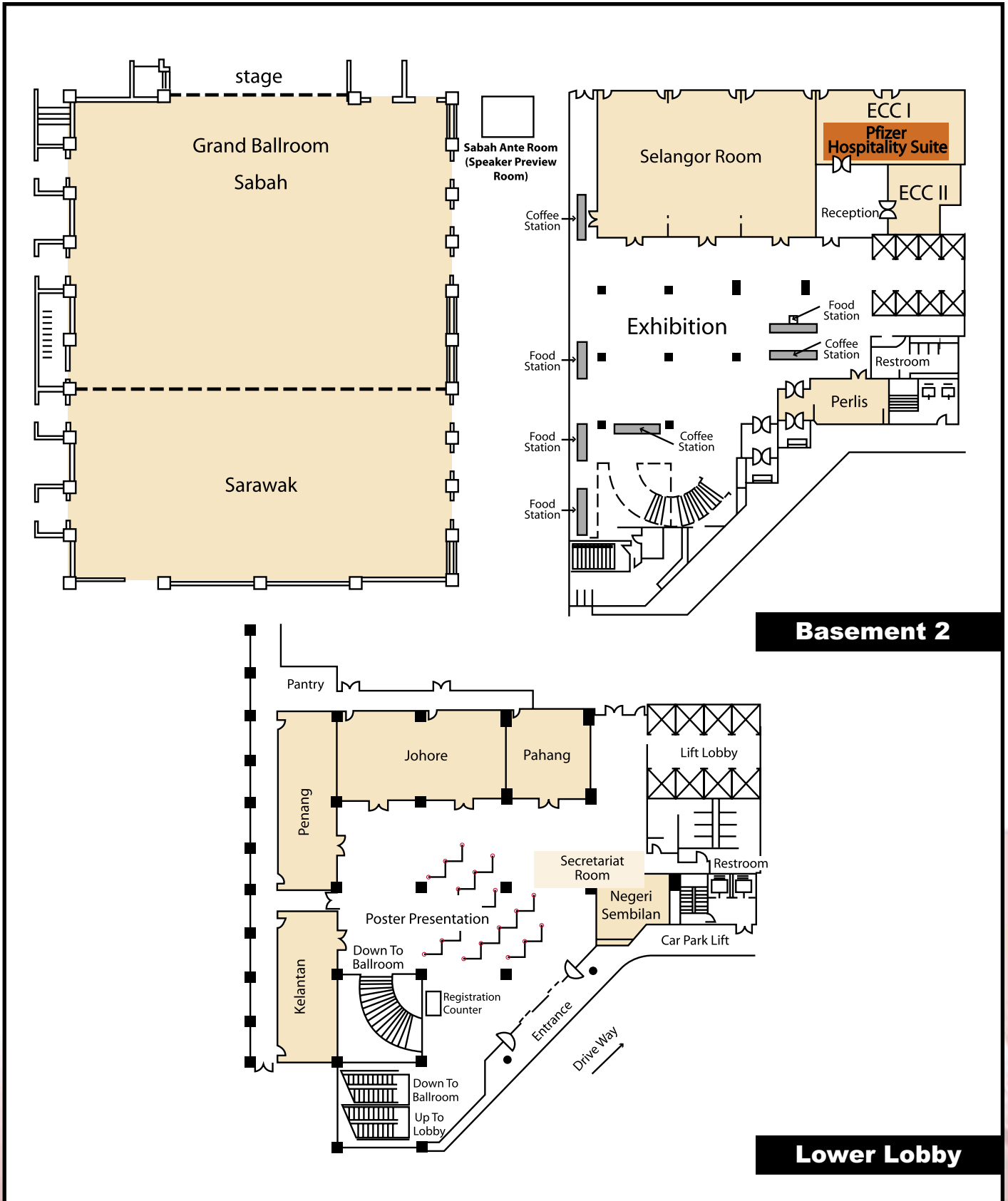

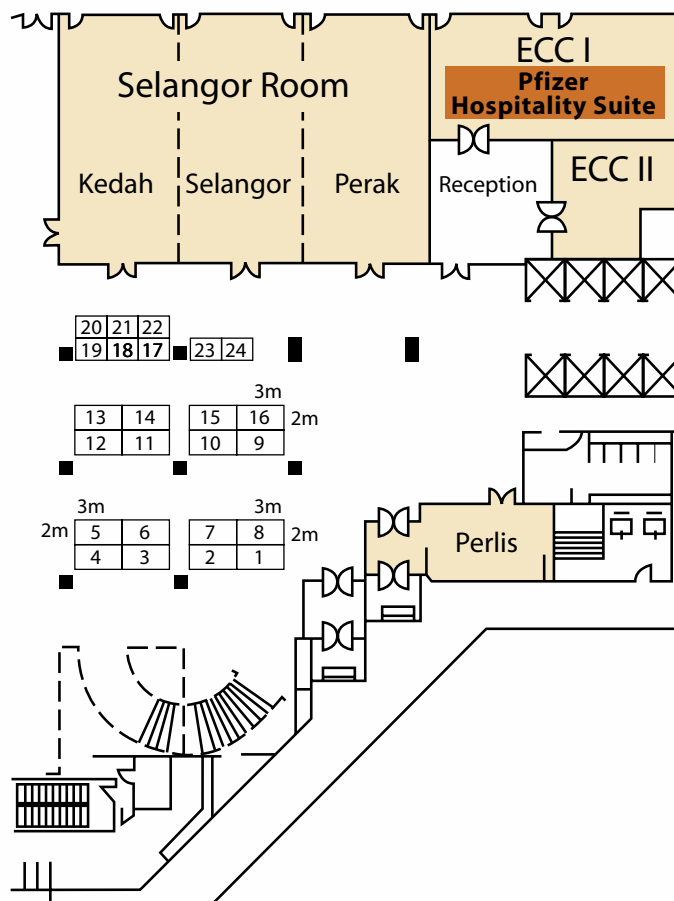

VENUE LAYOUT PLAN





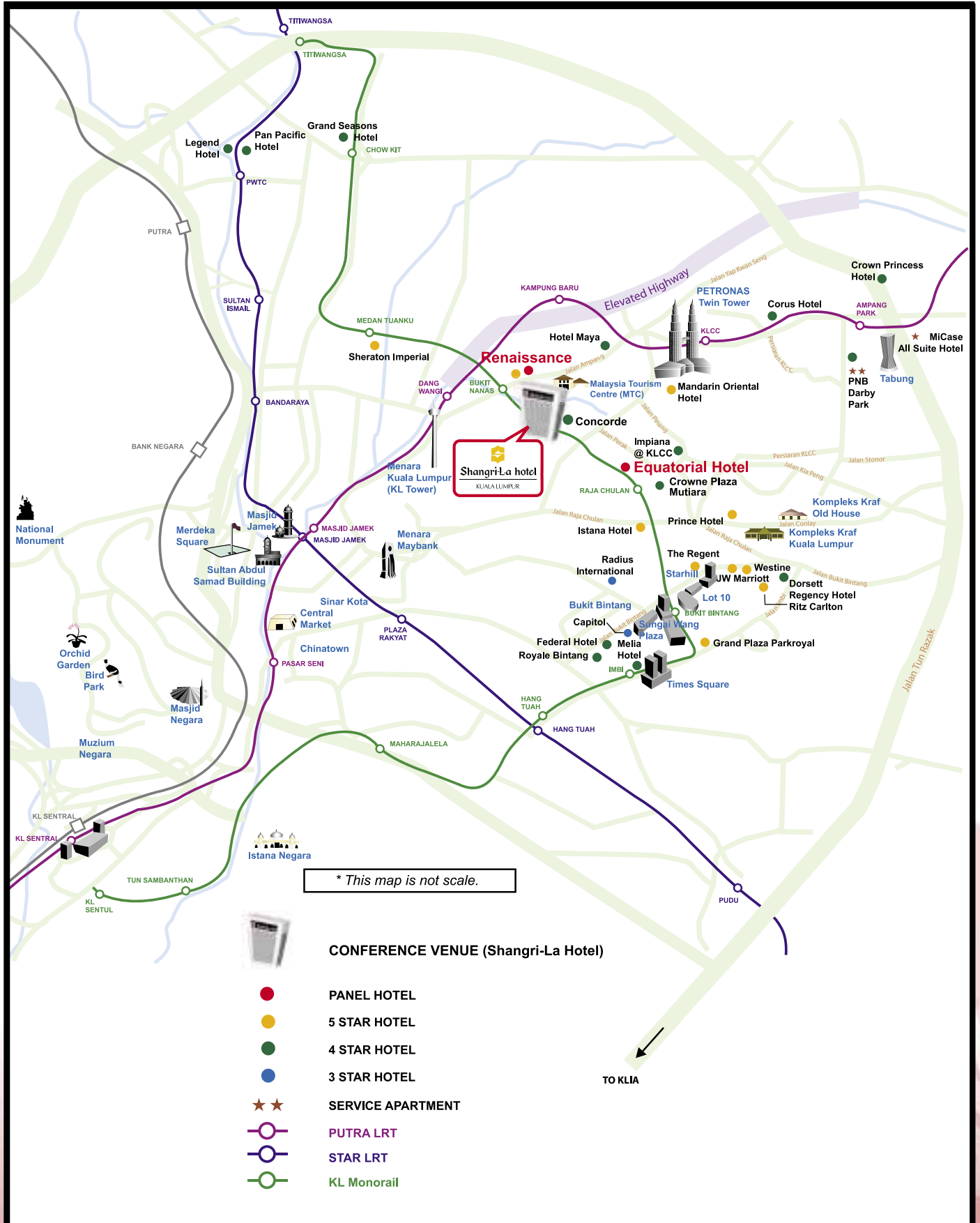
